# YF&R, high school discussion meet registration now open

Limited to 20 participants, the high school discussion meet takes place on Thursday, Nov. 10, starting with orientation at 5 p.m. The top four participants will receive a scholarship ranging from \$1,500 to \$250.

The winner of the discussion meet

will receive an all-expense paid trip to the American Farm Bureau Convention Jan. 6-11 in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and a John Deere Z355E ZTrak Mower. The collegiate winner will receive an all-expense paid trip to the American Farm Bureau FUSION Conference in Jacksonville, Florida.
