ore than 1,300 students gathered at the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds in Oklahoma City for the Oklahoma State Fair Livestock Judging Contest sponsored by the Oklahoma Farm Bureau Young Farmers and Ranchers on Sept. 16.

Students from third through 12th grades in 4-H and FFA competed in market and breeding classes of beef cattle, swine, sheep and goats.

Students in junior and senior age divisions evaluated each class and answered questions on two of the classes as individuals and as teams.

The high individual and high team members of each division were presented a jacket and an award. Awards also were presented to the second- and third-place individuals and first- through third-place teams. Ribbons were awarded to the top 10 in each class.
